CAMPSITE BASICS

- A VIP Admission Pass is required for every camper.
- Set up only within your assigned campsite.
- Standard campsites are 35 feet long.
- Campers may begin arriving at noon on Friday, September 25.
- All campers must be removed by 6 PM on Sunday, September 27.



QUIET HOURS & COURTESY

- Quiet time is from 12:30 AM to 7:00 AM.
- Be considerate of neighboring campers.
- Keep music, conversations, and generators at a reasonable volume.
- Respect shared areas and the space around nearby campsites.



FIRE, COOKING & SAFETY

- Campfires are not allowed anywhere on Fair Park grounds.
- Cooking grills may be used responsibly.
- Never leave a grill unattended while in use.
- Do not dump hot coals or ashes on the ground.
- Drive slowly and watch carefully for guests, children, and pets.
- Reckless driving or disruptive behavior in the camping area is not permitted.



ELECTRIC, WATER & FACILITIES

- Each site includes one 50 AMP, one 30 AMP, and one 20 AMP power connection.
- Water hookups are available in the camping area.
- Adjacent campsites share water hookups, so please bring a hose splitter.
- Seasonal shower facilities are available on site.
- The on-site dumping station includes two drive-up lanes.



PETS

- Pets are welcome, but they must remain leashed.
- Pet owners are responsible for cleaning up waste.
- Aggressive pets or excessive barking may not be allowed to remain.



TRASH & CLEANUP

- A trash barrel will be provided at each campsite.
- Keep your campsite tidy throughout your stay.
- Bag your garbage and dispose of it properly.
- Please leave your campsite clean when you depart.



ALCOHOL & CONDUCT

- Alcohol is allowed at campsites for guests of legal drinking age.
- Underage drinking is strictly prohibited.
- Fighting, threatening behavior, or disorderly conduct may result in removal from the grounds.
